### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overall cruise travel conditions are MODERATE / BE AWARE. A Gulf tropical system is affecting Texas and Louisiana, with possible knock-on effects for Galveston schedules and transfers. The Pacific tropics remain active, while Rhine water levels are improving. A Carnival Firenze medical evacuation is a useful reminder that onboard teams stabilize and coordinate care; there has been no new qualifying CDC gastrointestinal outbreak since July.

### THIS WEEK IN CRUISE HEALTH & SAFETY

#### GULF SYSTEM & GALVESTON

PLAN AHEAD

A tropical system is affecting Texas and Louisiana. Monitor port, airport, and cruise-line notices; leave extra time for Galveston transfers and keep a weather-flexible plan.

#### PACIFIC TROPICS

STAY ALERT

The Pacific tropics are active. This is not a reason to cancel a cruise by itself, but it is a reason to check the National Hurricane Center before departure and on sea days.

#### CARNIVAL FIRENZE

MEDICAL

A medical evacuation example shows how ship teams stabilize a patient, consult shoreside specialists, and coordinate a transfer. Travelers should know the medical center location and how to call for help.

#### RHINE WATER LEVELS

IMPROVING

Rhine water levels are improving, easing pressure on river itineraries. Operators may still adjust ports or use coach transfers; confirm the latest plan before sailing.

#### CDC GI OUTBREAK WATCH

NO NEW

No new qualifying CDC gastrointestinal outbreak has been reported since July. Routine handwashing and prompt symptom reporting still matter.

#### TRAVEL TAKEAWAY

BE AWARE

Build flexibility into weather-sensitive travel, protect medications from water, and save the ship's medical and emergency instructions before sail-away.

## CRUISE INDUSTRY INTELLIGENCE

### DISNEY RETURNS TO NEW YORK

Disney Cruise Line is returning to New York, expanding Northeast access for families and seasonal sailings.

### PHILADELPHIA CRUISE TERMINAL

Philadelphia's cruise terminal remains a useful regional option, with port access that can reduce air travel for Mid-Atlantic guests.

### GALVESTON TERMINAL EXPANSION

Terminal expansion is shaping future capacity in Galveston; allow extra time for construction-related traffic and terminal directions.

### OCEANIA SONATA MILESTONE

Oceania's Sonata milestone highlights continued investment in smaller-ship, destination-focused cruising.

## DESTINATION SPOTLIGHT: GALVESTON

### WHAT TO WATCH

Gulf weather can change port operations quickly. Check your cruise line's boarding notice, terminal instructions, and transfer status before leaving Houston or the surrounding area.

#### TRAVEL SMART

Keep a waterproof medication pouch, build a time buffer, and save an alternate route to the terminal.

**EMERGENCY: 911**

### MEDICAL EMERGENCY AT SEA

Call the ship's emergency number or medical center immediately. Follow crew instructions, bring medication and identification, and ask what care is available onboard. The team may stabilize, consult shoreside clinicians, or coordinate evacuation; travel insurance and evacuation coverage can be important.

## HEALTH & SAFETY INTELLIGENCE

### TRAVELING WITH TEENAGERS

Set a simple check-in plan, review hydration and sun exposure, pack familiar medications, and tell teens how to find the medical center. Encourage early reporting of fever, vomiting, diarrhea, breathing trouble, or injury.

### MYTH VS. FACT: SHIP MEDICAL

**MYTH:** a ship medical facility works exactly like a shoreside ER.  
**FACT:** it is designed to assess and stabilize, with services and costs that vary. Know the limits, keep insurance details handy, and ask about evacuation procedures.
